

Clonakilty Autism Friendly Town Plan 2018 -2021

Principles of an Autism Friendly town

- 1. Improve awareness of autism with a view to greater acceptance of autism amongst the general public in Clonakilty
- 2. Make it easier for the autistic community to live and work in Clonakilty
- 3. Make it easier for the autistic community to visit Clonakilty
- 4. Seek to combat the stigma around autism and recognise the diverse experience of those with the condition
- 5. Give an autistic perspective to organisations that seek support
- 6. Be an example for other towns and villages in Ireland
- 7. Increase employment opportunities for autistic people

Build Landscape

- Installation of a sensory garden near Model Railway Station
- Install visual signage at the entrance, exit and key public areas
- Make improvements in the playground to make it more Autism Friendly
- Consult with County Council twice yearly on Autism Accessibility in the town
- Create a town-wide "sensory alert" system this would be housed on the "Autism in Clonakilty" webpage and would notify autistic people of any changes to the environment/building work. Example http://www.niassembly.gov.uk/visit-and-learning/autism-and-the-assembly/
- Explore other sensory installations in the town: eg. soft lighting in all public spaces

Public Awareness & Understanding

- Host an annual autism awareness day in the town, with input and direction from autistic people
- Host an annual briefing for other towns and villages on building an Autism Friendly Town
- Bring Autism Experience to Clonakilty Annually for 3 years running
- Building Clonakilty's reputation as an "Autism Hub" by holding an annual "Clonakilty Lecture" on autism from a leading international expert
- Promote Clonakilty Autism Friendly Town through tourism channels
- Encourage event organisers to integrate autism friendly element to their events
- Autism Friendly Annual Update 9th October
- Use "I Love Clonakilty" website to give a monthly tip on gaining a better understanding around Autism and the needs Autistic people.



Healthcare & Public Services

- Train staff in communicating using alternative communication systems
- Allow autistic people to select preferred modes of communication
- Provide the opportunity for familiarisation visits

Education

- Develop self-advocacy training for young autistic people
- Ensure every student receives autism awareness training whilst in school

Employment

- Develop a work experience and internship programme for autistic people who are still in education
- Grow employment opportunities for autistic people and their carers

Retail & Business / Hospitality

- Develop a webpage "Autism Friendly Town in Clonakilty"
- Agree a weekly/monthly autism friendly evening, standard across the town

Performance Review

- Prepare an Annual Report
- Monitor adherence by participating members
- Grow number of participating organisations
