I stand next to my horse and wait for my instructor to tell me that it is safe to climb up the steps.



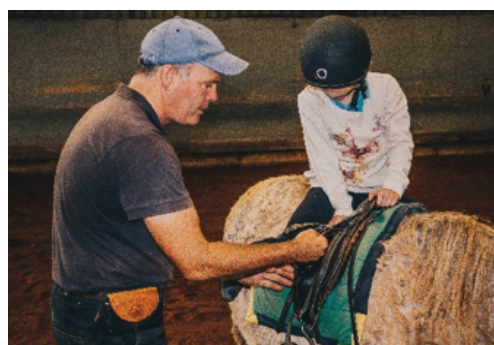
I climb onto my horse, and sit still to let my instructor tie the saddle tightly. This is so I won't fall off
